


#### Introduction

- Zimbabwe National Statistics Agency (ZIMSTAT) collects administrative data on prisoners from Zimbabwe Prisons and Correctional Services (ZPCS) for use in the production of Quarterly Prison Admissions and Discharges Statistics reports.
- The 2024 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Prison Admissions and Discharges Statistics report sheds light on the prison population, the number and profile of prisoners who get admitted into, and those who get discharged from the country's prison facilities.

#### **Results**

#### **Prison Population**

At the end of the fourth quarter of 2024 there were 22,878 prisoners in prison facilities throughout the country.





## **Imprisonment Rates**




The National Imprisonment rate was 146 per 100,000 people

The Imprisonment rate among males was 294 per 100,000 people

The Imprisonment rate among females was 9 per 100,000 people

Comparison of Prison Population Between 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2024 and 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2024




- ❖ The prison population increased from 22,156 in Q3 of 2024 to 22,878 in Q4 of 2024.
- During the same period, the population of male prisoners increased from 20,373 to 22,130.
- ❖ Female prisoners decreased from 783 in Q3 of 2024 to 748 in Q4 of 2024.

#### **Prison Population (Sentenced and Unsentenced Prisoners)**

Among the 22,878 prisoners held in Zimbabwe's prisons, 17,610 (77.0%) were sentenced and 5,268 (23.0%) were unsentenced.

- a) Of 22,130 male prisoners, 17,127 (77.4%) were and sentenced and 5,003 (22.6%) were unsentenced
- Among the 748 female prisoners, 483 (64.6%) were sentenced and 265 (35.4%) were unsentenced

# Sentence Status of Prisoner Population: 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2024 and 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2024

- a) Sentenced prisoners increased from 17,151 in Q3 of 2024 to 17,610
- b) in Q4 of 2024.
- c) During the same period unsentenced prisoners increased slightly from 5,005 to 5,268

#### Prison Admissions: 4th Quarter 2024




A total of 14,670 new prisoners were admitted during the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter of 2024

Male prisoners were 13,656 (93.1%)

Female prisoners were 1,014 (6.9%)

#### New Prison Admissions: 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2024 and 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2024



- a) New prison admissions decreased from 15,422 in Q3 of 2024 to 14,670 in Q4 of 2024.
- b) The new male prisoner population decreased from 14,275 to 13,656 and the population of new female prisoners decreased slightly from 1,147 to 1,014.

#### **Prison Admissions (Continued)**

Among the 14,670 new prisoners admitted, 12,681 (86.4%) were admitted as unsentenced prisoners and 1,989 (13.6%) had a sentence.





11,762 (84.1%) were unsentenced 1,894 (13.9%) were sentenced.



919 (90.6%) were unsentenced 95 (9.4%) were sentenced.

# **Prison Discharges**

A total of 13,876 prisoners were discharged from prison during the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter of 2024





12,654 (91.2%) were male



1,222 (8.8%) were female

# **Prison Discharges (Continued)**

Of the 13,876 prisoners who were discharged from prison, 7,839 (56.4%) were sentenced and 6,037 (43.6%) were unsentenced



# **New Prisoners By Age Group And Sex**

The highest proportion of both new male and female prisoners were in the 20-24 and 25-29 age groups. It can be observed that after the age group 25 to 29, the number of new prisoners decreases with increasing age



# New prisoners by Province of Usual Residence and sex

- a) Most new prisoners usually lived in Harare (24.5%), followed by Midlands (13.5%) and Mashonaland West (10.1%).
- b) Most new male prisoners usually lived in Harare (24.3%), followed by Midlands (13.7%)and Mashonaland West (10.3%).
- c) The majority of new female prisoners were from Harare (27.2%), followed by Mashonaland Central (14.8%) and Midlands (10.6%).

# Reported Last Employment Status of New Prisoners By Sex

- The majority of new prisoners reported that they were employed before admission (53.2%)
- Male prisoners who were unemployed constituted 46.1% of the new male prisoner population.
- The share of female prisoners who reported that they were unemployed before their admission to prison was 56.1 %

#### **Crime Count For New Prisoners**

The 14,670 prisoners that were admitted during the fourth quarter of 2024 had committed 16,740 offences. Of these offences, 15,614 were committed by males and 1,126 by females.



# **Top Five Crimes Committed By New Prisoners**

Most of the new prisoners were admitted into prison for committing theft (23.2%), assault (19.4%), burglary (8.6%), other criminal acts not elsewhere classified (6.3%) and robbery without firearm (5.4%). The crimes that led to the imprisonment of female prisoners were mostly theft (26.9%), assault (23.2%), other criminal acts not elsewhere classified (7.7%) and fraud (5.9%).

### **Crime Type And Counts By Nationality Of Prisoners**

New prisoners of Zimbabwean nationality were mostly imprisoned for theft (23.5%), assault (19.7%), burglary (8.8%), other criminal acts not elsewhere classified (6.3%) and robbery without firearm (5.4%).

New Non-Zimbabwean prisoners committed mostly immigration-related offences (60.1%) and trade or possession of protected or prohibited species of fauna and flora (16.0%).
