ZIMSTAT Launches 2025 Social Registry Survey: Listing of Households and Data Collection

Harare, 13 October 2025 — The Zimbabwe National Statistics Agency (ZIMSTAT), in collaboration with the Ministry of Public Service, Labour and Social Welfare, is pleased to announce the commencement of the 2025 Zimbabwe Social Registry Survey (ZISO) — a national initiative to collect household-level data for the establishment of a comprehensive Zimbabwe Social Registry.

The Social Registry is a key instrument in strengthening social protection, poverty reduction, and inclusive development in Zimbabwe. It will serve as a unified data and information system to support the planning, implementation, and monitoring of social protection and social development programs.

The first round of the survey will cover a Census of households in Mangwe, Nkayi, and Mudzi Districts, representing about 2% of the national population. The exercise will expand progressively to cover all 65 districts of Zimbabwe.

The Social Registry will enable the Government and its partners to:

- a) Identify households for potential social protection and development interventions;
- b) Enhance fairness and transparency in targeting while reducing duplication and leakages;
- c) **Promote coordination** among Government Ministries, Departments, Agencies, and Development Partners through a common data source;
- d) Support evidence-based policy-making, monitoring, and evaluation of social programs.

The survey will collect data on demographics, education, employment, housing, land ownership, access to services, economic activities, and household vulnerabilities. This information will directly contribute to

improved service delivery, strengthened social safety nets, and support Zimbabwe's progress towards Vision 2030.

Objectives of the 2025 Social Registry Survey include:

- a) Establishing a comprehensive national social registry to underpin social development and poverty reduction initiatives;
- b) Enhancing efficiency and coordination in social development programming;
- c) Providing an updated socio-economic data source for evidence-based decision-making;
- d) Strengthening transparency and accountability in program delivery; and
- e) Enabling rapid response mechanisms during shocks such as droughts or economic crises.

The 2025 Social Registry Survey is being implemented by **ZIMSTAT**, with technical and financial support from the **Government of Zimbabwe**, the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (**SIDA**), Swiss Development Cooperation (**SDC**), the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (**UK**), the European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (**ECHO**), and the **World Bank**, in collaboration with **UNICEF** and the **World Food Programme** (**WFP**).

The Ministry of Public Service, Labour and Social Welfare is leading the initiative in alignment with the National Social Protection Policy Framework (NSPPF).

ZIMSTAT calls upon all households in Mangwe, Nkayi, and Mudzi to cooperate fully with enumerators and to provide accurate information during the data collection exercise. The credibility and success of this national initiative and, by extension, the effectiveness of Zimbabwe's social protection programs depend on the active participation of every household.
