
#### Introduction

- Zimbabwe National Statistics Agency (ZIMSTAT) collects administrative data on prisoners from Zimbabwe Prisons and Correctional Services (ZPCS) for use in the production of Quarterly Prison Admissions and Discharges Statistics reports.
- The 2025 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Prison Admissions and Discharges Statistics report sheds light on the prison population, the number and profile of prisoners who get admitted into, and those who get discharged from the country's prison facilities.

#### **Results**

#### **Prison Population**

At the end of the second quarter of 2025 there were 24,089 prisoners in prison facilities throughout the country.





#### **Imprisonment Rates**




The National Imprisonment rate was 151 per 100,000 people

The Imprisonment rate among males was 305 per 100,000 people

The Imprisonment rate among females was 10 per 100,000 people

Comparison of Prison Population Between Ist Quarter 2025 and 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2025





- The prison population increased from 23,654 in QI of 2025 to 24,089 in QI of 2025.
- During the same period, the population of male prisoners increased from 22,130 to 22,130.
- Female prisoners decreased from 748 in Q4 of 2024 to 748 in Q1 of 2025.

#### **Prison Population (Sentenced and Unsentenced Prisoners)**

Among the 24,089 prisoners held in Zimbabwe's prisons, 19,727 (81.9%) were sentenced and 4,362 (18.1%) were unsentenced.

- a) Of 23,284 male prisoners, 19,138 (82.2%) were and sentenced and 4,146 (17.8%) were unsentenced
- a) Among the 805 female prisoners,589 (73.2%) were sentenced and216 (26.8%) were unsentenced





## Sentence Status of Prisoner Population: 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2025 and 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2025

- a) Sentenced prisoners increased from 18,857 in Q1 of 2025 to 19,727 in Q2 of 2025.
- a) During the same period unsentenced prisoners decreased slightly from 4,797 to 4,362.
- b) Sentenced male prisoners increased from 18,348 to 19,138.
- c) Unsentenced male prisoners decreased from 4,541 to 4,146.
- d) Sentenced female prisoners also increased slightly from 509 to 589.
- (f) Unsentenced female prisoners decreased from 256 in Q1 of 2025 to 216 in Q2 of 2025.

#### Prison Admissions: 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2025




A total of 16,187 new prisoners were admitted during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter of 2025

Male prisoners were 14,956 (92.4%)

Female prisoners were 1,231 (7.6%)

#### New Prison Admissions: Ist Quarter 2025 and 2nd Quarter 2025



- a) New prison admissions decreased from 16,762 in QI of 2025 to 16,187 in Q2 of 2025.
- b) The new male prisoner population increased from 15,581 to 14,956 and the population of new female prisoners decreased slightly from 1,181 to 1,231.

#### **Prison Admissions (Continued)**

Among the 16,187 new prisoners admitted, 13,487 (83.3%) were admitted as unsentenced prisoners and 2,700 (16.7%) had a sentence.





12,490 (83.5%) were unsentenced

2,466 (16.5%) were sentenced.



997 (81.0%) were unsentenced

234 (19.0%) were sentenced.

## **Prison Discharges**

A total of 15,742 prisoners were discharged from prison during the 2nd Quarter of 2025





14,378 (91.3%) were male



1,364 (8.7%) were female

## **Prison Discharges (Continued)**

Of the 15,742 prisoners who were discharged from prison, 8,953 (56.9%) were sentenced and 6,789 (43.1%) were unsentenced.



## **New Prisoners By Age Group And Sex**

The highest proportion of both new male and female prisoners were in the 25-29 and 20-24 age groups. It can be observed that after the age group 25 to 29, the number of new prisoners decreases with increasing age.



### New prisoners by Province of Usual Residence and sex

- a) Most new prisoners usually lived in Harare (22.6%), followed by Manicaland (12.3%), Midlands (11.7%) and Mashonaland West (11.1%).
- b) Most new male prisoners usually lived in Harare (22.4%), followed by Manicaland (12.4%)and Midlands (11.9%).
- c) The majority of new female prisoners were from Harare (24.4%), followed by Midlands (10.3%) and Manicaland (10.2%).

# Reported Last Employment Status of New Prisoners By Sex

- 53% of new prisoners reported being employed prior to admission.
- Male prisoners who were unemployed constituted 46.2% of the new male prisoner population.
- The share of female prisoners who reported that they were unemployed before their admission to prison was 56.6%

#### **Crime Count For New Prisoners**

The 16,187 prisoners that were admitted during the second quarter of 2025 had committed 18,718 offences. Of these offences, 17,366 were committed by males and 1,352 by females.



### **Top Five Crimes Committed By New Prisoners**

Most of the new prisoners were admitted into prison for committing theft (22.1%), assault (19.7%), burglary (8.7%), robbery without firearm (5.4%) and other criminal acts not elsewhere classified (5.3%). The crimes that led to the imprisonment of female prisoners were mostly theft (26.9%), assault (23.2%), unlawful acts involving controlled drugs or precursors (8.1%) and acts related to migration (5.6%).
